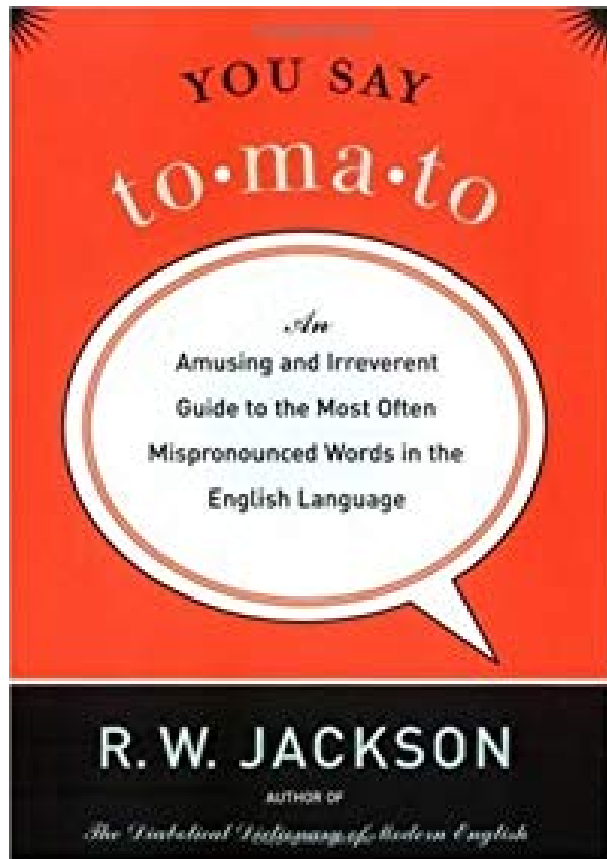


# You Say Tomato: An Amusing and Irreverent Guide to the Most Often Mispronounced Words in the English Language
