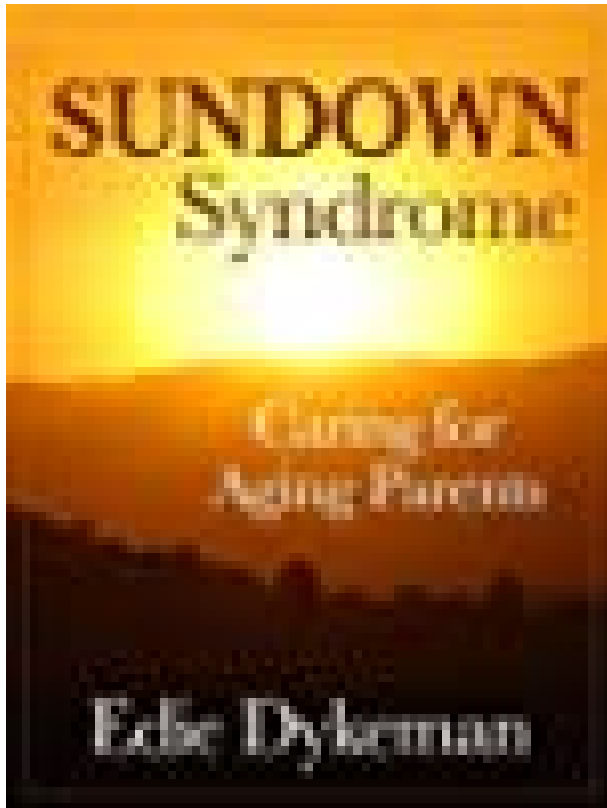


# Sundown Syndrome (Caring for Aging Parents)
